



Small Group Questions for Discussion:

Becoming Aware of Homelessness

Facilitator Note:

Prepare participants to view the Call to Arms video. Use a comfortable space where you can speak together without interruption if possible. Depending on how much the group engages, this could take up to an hour.

Please feel free to add or adapt questions for your group.

Begin with prayer, and then spend a few minutes sharing your own personal thoughts or experiences of homelessness, interactions with the homeless or homeless outreach.

Talk about why each of you are there and what you hope to learn.

Respond to the Following Questions:

1. How has the presentation changed or reinforced your strategy for reaching people?
2. Has the presentation challenged any conceptions you have held about homelessness?
3. Are there any aspects of the presentation that you disagree with? If so, what are they and why?

4. Who has been most influential in reaching you with the Gospel? How did they do it?
How might you apply this to a strategy for sharing Jesus with the homeless?
5. What are primary characteristics to building a trusting a relationship?
6. What are some fears you have for engaging a group of people like the homeless?
7. Surveying the New Testament, do you see building relationships as a key to evangelism?
If, not what is? If yes, what are some scriptures, besides the ones mentioned, that show building relationships as key?
8. What do you feel the speaker wanted you to do with their material? What do you think you will do differently as a result of watching?
9. As a group, outline a strategic plan for reaching out to the homeless based on what was shared.
10. Ask the group if they have any questions that they would like the group to address or discuss regarding what was shared.
